## **Annual Highlights 2018**

The Center for Chromosome Stability (CCS) has had a very successful year scientifically, with several publications in prestigious journals, as well as an impressive record of CCS group leaders giving presentations at major international conferences. Significant external grant funding has also been secured in 2018, both for defined projects and for personal fellowships. Most notably, the Hickson and Hoffmann groups were awarded a 15 Mio DKK grant from the Novo Nordisk Foundation as part of the foundation's Interdisciplinary Synergy initiative. As detailed in last year's report, the CCS has acquired additional office and laboratory space in the ICMM. In 2018, the CCS developed further their own imaging facility, and occupied a newly refurbished laboratory for the processing of human oocytes and mouse tissues (for the Hoffmann and Lopez-Contreras groups). Finally, the CCS has been very active in disseminating our activities to the general public via press releases and social media, as well as by the organization of outreach activities.
